## Columbus bounces back 4-3

Waterloo Public is still looking for its first high school hockey victory over rival Columbus of Waterloo after the Sailors' 4-3 overtime win Friday night in an exciting district final Friday night at McElroy Auditorium.

And, both sides are hoping for a fifth intra-city match this season.

The two advance to the state tournament which begins Thursday in Des Moines. They can meet again in the Sunday afternoon championship game if they win all their preliminary games.

Public came within 7 seconds of its initial victory over Columbus in the 7 times the Waterloo teams have met in 3

The Warriors went ahead 3-2 with just 32 seconds left in regulation. Mike Lamb scored from the right slot while Public enjoyed a 2-skater advantage.

The Public celebration started, but it proved to be premature.

KEVIN LANDAU tied the game up for Columbus with just 7 seconds left when he pushed the puck in past goalie Eric

Brian Trowbridge followed with the Sailor winner 53 seconds into overtime. Trowbridge's slap shot from the blue line caught the roof of the goal.

Landau's marker came when both team were skating one man short. Max Lamb received a holding penalty for Waterloo Public just 6 seconds earlier.

Columbus coach Duke Dutkowski pulled his goalie to get a 5-4 skater

"It's unfortunate one team had to lose a game like this." said Dutkowski. "Both teams played so well.

Columbus regained a 1-goal lead, 2-1, on Craig Brown's power play slap shot with 4:52 remaining in the game.

Bill Kammeyer tied it up with 2:03 showing on the clock. Kammeyer finished off a rink-long rush by poking the puck in from under a pile of Columbus players to the right of the net.

Then, came the frantic final half minute when Public scored the go-ahead goal and Columbus responded with the tying score.

"YOU CAN'T come much closer than that." said Public coach Dave Swick. "What a tough one to lose.

"You can't say we didn't try, though. "What a good, good hockey game." he continued."Eric was just fantastic!"

If a Des Moines district ends as expected Sunday. Public will probably play Iowa High School League division I cochampion Dowling of West Des Moines in a first round game Thursday night.

Columbus would then play a 9:30 p.m. against the Des Moines distrrict runnerup, which will likely be Urbandale. Dowling, like defending state champion Columbus, finished 10-2 in the league while Urbandale was last with an 1-11 record.

Public has split with Dowling while Columbus topped Urbandale twice.

"Maybe it just wasn't in our cards to be Columbus this year." concluded Swick after the disheartening loss. "Not until the state tournament, at least," he quickly added with a grin.
