

Public speeds to 10-1 romp after starting slowly

URBANDALE—Waterloo Public started out slowly Friday night but then skated to a 10-1 romp over Ankeny in a first round Iowa State High School Hockey Tournament victory here.

Public, which won the division I regular season crown, was outshot 13-8 in the opening stanza by Ankeny, which finished on the bottom of the league's standings.

The Warriors, however, managed to lead 1-0 after those first 15 minutes.

Then, they exploded for four goals in the second period and five more in the third.

It was 8-0 Public when Ankeny ruined Eric Petersen's shutout bid with just over five minutes left in the game.

Public received balanced scoring from all of its forward lines.

Steve Kammeyer, freshman Jeff Lamb and Mike Messerer all scored twice for Public.

Mike Lamb, Max Lamb, Tim Welsh and Tim Boswell all contributed a goal to Public's winning cause.

Public wound up firing 54 shots on goal.

The first-round victory set up Saturday night's all-Waterloo semifinal game between Columbus and Public.

Andy Lyons second goal of the game, 50 seconds into overtime, gave Dowling of West Des Moines a 5-4 victory over Sioux City in Friday night's other semifinal game here.
