DES MOINES (AP) — Mark Lanigan's goal in overtime gave Waterloo Columbus a 4-3 victory-over rival Waterloo for its fourth state high school hockey title in six years Sunday. Sioux City grabbed third place in the tournament by downing Des Moines Hoover-Roosevelt, 6-2. Des Moines Valley slipped past Urbandale 5-4 for fifth place and Ames upset Des Moines Dowling 9-4 for seventh place.

Mason City lost 9-2 to Urbandale in the consolation bracket Saturday and wound up eighth in the nine-team field. John Brandt got two goals and Jim Nielsen two assists for Mason City, which

wound up with a 5-13 record overall.

Brandt, No. 5 scorer in the league, was named to the second all-state team as a center. Teammates Bill Johann, forward, and Jay Bloomfield, defense, were honorable mention.
