

Warriors blank Valley-Dowling in tourney semis

AMES — Speed and defense was the name of the game here Friday night for the Waterloo Warriors as they moved into Saturday's championship game of the 1986 Iowa High School Hockey League State Tournament.

Thanks largely in part to Carlos Clayburn's outstanding goaltending, the Warriors blanked Valley-Dowling, 4-0, to keep alive their hopes of

successfully defending their state title from a year ago when they handed Ames a 4-3 loss in the finals.

Ames, 18-1, will again be pitted against the Warriors, 16-4, in the finals after the Little Cyclones defeated Urbandale, 9-1, in Friday's other semi-final round game.

In a consolation game played earlier Friday, Sioux City scored two goals in the third period to pull away from Columbus of Waterloo, 4-2, to end the Sailors season at 2-18.

Warriors coach Dave Swick was pleased with his team's effort against Valley-Dowling, which is the only team to defeat Ames this season.

"Carlos had a tremendous game in goal," Swick said. "If he can do that again Saturday against Ames we'll have a chance to win."

After a scoreless first period for both teams, the Warriors exploded for three quick goals in a span of 3:07 of the second period to take com-

mand.

Their scoring came against the ISHL's top goalie, senior Scott Geiger, who is a two-time All-State pick.

"HE'S the best," said Swick. "We had our chances in the first period against him, but came away empty. Eventually we'll get something if we keep attacking."

The Warriors' first goal came at 2:39 of the second period by forward

Brian Carnes, who slipped in a rebound off the pads of Geiger.

Just two minutes later, the Warriors Del Donaldson put on "his bread-and-butter move", according to Swick, to hit the net for a 2-0 Warriors lead.

Donaldson came charging down the left side with the puck on his backhand side before neatly cutting back in front of the net to his forehand and sliding the puck between Geiger's leg pads.

One minute and 35 seconds later, Erik Runge scored on a breakaway to give the Warriors their third goal of the period. Brian Carnes set up the score when he knocked down a slap shot at the Valley-Dowling blue line. The puck rolled to Runge, who was then off to the races, and with a nifty juke, he beat Geiger for a 3-0 Warriors lead.
