Valley-Dowling wins hockey league crown

Register Staff Writer Tony Dressen scored three goals and goalie James McGalliard stopped 24 shots to lead West Des Moines Valley-Dowling to its second straight Iowa High School Hockey League tournament championship, 9-0, over Dubuque Sunday at the Des Moines Ice Arena

Dressen and McGalliard were named Most Valuable Players. The victory capped a 23-0 season for Valley-Dowling.

Dressen, a senior at Dowling High School, scored the first two goals just 1 minute, 15 seconds apart in the first period with both teams skating two men short because of penalties. Dressen added his third goal on a powerplay shot with 8 minutes 1 second left in the third period.

"This morning, when I was in church, I told myself it would be a 4-1 game," Dressen said, "but when we started going, and I put a couple in, I knew it would be a big win for us."

It was the second shutout this

season for McGalliard, also a senior. "As the game wore on, I tried not to think about [the shutout], because I knew that I might blow it, " McGalliard said. "It was always in the back of my mind, but the team victory

comes first.

"The hometown crowd and the defense really helped out," McGalliard said. "A lot of times, I'd save the first shot, and the rebound would come out in front, and [the defense] would clear it away. If the rebound sits there, (the opposition) has a chance to put it in, and those are the hardest shots to

Valley-Dowling co-coach Kevin Kahoot said, "You can never expect a shutout in a championship game. That's the finest game [McGalliard's] played all year.

"We were a little rough at first, but then we opened it up and made Dubuque play our game," Kahoot said. "The defense hustled; they were first on the puck the whole game, and they never let Dubuque in the game."

Dubuque finished the season with a 14-8-1 record.

Five Valley-Dowling players were named to the league's all-star team, led by Dressen and McGalliard. The other Tigers named to the team were forwards Brian Krueger and Jon Strako and defenseman Ryan Good-
