for a state high school hockey title.

But. The good are made better by ill, right? And the bad affright afflicts the best.

Just so for the Sioux City Metros, who won their second straight Iowa High School Hockey League tour-nament championship Sunday after-noon with a 5-2 triumph over Mason City before 1,000 fans at Municipal

Auditorium.

The Metros, stripped of two-thirds of their high production forward line in a Saturday win over Ames, became the third team to win backto-back crowns in the 16-year history of the tournament.

Waterloo Columbus twice (1977-78 and 1981-82) and West Des Moines Valley/Dowling (1988-89) were the other teams to capture two

championships in succession.
Two goals by T.J. Juon and redlighters by Karri Poykio, Cory
Roberts and Eric Rubel powered the
Metros to the winners' circle.

In a nail-biting come-from-behind victory over Ames Saturday to reach

the finals, the Metros lost right winger Jesper Kilander to a seasonending leg injury and center Jesse Monell drew a misconduct penalty that disqualified him from Sunday's

championship fray.

Monell was first and Kilander fourth in IHSHL regular-season

scoring.
With the two gone, Coach Dave Davies had to move the remaining third of the high-scoring line, his son Daniel, to defense for much of the Saturday win and that was again the case Sunday.

Davies was third in regular-season scoring, but was utilized on detense Sunday to slow down Mason City.

'We all had to pull together with Jesse and Karri out of there," said Davies, who had two assists, but no goals. "We knew we had to come up with a great performance.

There was a lot of pressure some guys who'd never had that pressure before and they came through with flying colors."

Coach Davies agreed.
"Some of our kids did a great job
all season as role players, but with Jesse and Karri gone they had to step up and play under pressure. They did a great job, too.
"I think they all have played great

defense this season, but with guys out of there who'd gotten a lot of ink, some others, all of them, won a state title for us,'' said Dave Davies.

The younger Davies, who will be a nior next fall at Heelan High School, was named the tournament's most valuable player

He and Metros defenseman Jade Pospeshil were also named to the IHSHL team that will represent the league in the Chicago tournament later this spring. Showcase

The elder Davies will coach the all-state squad.

In addition, Monell, goaltender Jesse Basarich, Pospeshil and Davies were named to the 18-player all-state hockey team in ceremonies after the title game.
