Walt Johnson, an assistant under Jim Peck last season, has taken over the head coaching duties, welcoming back 14 players with varsity experience. The Metros finished 16-12 overall and were fourth in the state tournament.

The puck drops at 3 p.m. for the varsity game each

day, following 1 o'clock junior varsity contests.

Johnson, in his second stint as Metros head coach, played for the Sioux City Musketeers for four seasons in the late 1970s. After his playing days, he coached the Metros during the 1979-80, '80-81 and '81-82

"I think you will see this team be near the top of the pack," said Johnson. "If they play consistent hockey and get the discipline thing going, we should get everything we need out of them.
