# Metros go for state hockey 'three-peat'

Four Iowa High School Hockey League teams posted better regular season records, but Coach Walt Johnson thinks his Sioux City Metros could bring home the title in this weekend's IHSHL varsity state

The eight-team competition gets under way today at the IBP Ice Center, just south of Lewis and

Three days of action, with four games daily, will decide the 24th champion since the prep first began in the winter of 1976-77.
