

od, but the Mohawks only managed one goal off of eight shots "We just missed the net a lot," the coach said. "We could

have had three or four goals in the first period, but we were just bombing them past the net into the glass.'

In the first period, Matt Metcalf put Waterloo in front, 1-0, 4:46 into the period, but the Mohawks tied the contest about a minute later when Cole Despenas scored off assists from Murtaugh and Maginnis.

Murtaugh said the Mohawks settled down after allowing the first goal to the Warriors.

"We just played our game," the senior forward said, "We knew coming in that they were going to take it to us. We settled down and started making good passes and took good shots. We played our game, it's as simple as that."

The six goals by the Mohawks were more than enough for junior goal tender Brent Frein, who stopped 25 of 27 shots.

"I was pretty nervous at the start of the game," said Frein, who was making his first state tournament appearance. "I started to calm down about halfway through the first period."

Hicks, who told Frein at Thursday's practice that he would be the Mohawks' starter in goal for the opener, was pleased with Frein's effort.

"Brent did a heckuva job, a heckuva job," Hicks said. "Like I said earlier in the week, I have confidence in both of our goalies. The players also have confidence in both of them. Tyler (Brown) will also play this weekend.
