We've been playing much better defensively late in the season," said Weinke, whose squad had an up-and-down, 15-17-1 regular season and enters the eight-team tournament as the seventh seed. "We haven't had much offen-

sive punch as of late, but we've been in all the games. I feel like we're peaking at the right time." Waterloo's defense starts with

all-star goaltender Larrabee, who has posted a 911 save percentage this season. Weinke doesn't hesitate to put a net full of responsibility on his goalie's shoulders. "He has played with a lot of

confidence for the last month." said Weinke. "He's kept us in most of the games, even when we've had breakdowns, and he's won a few games for us.

"He will be the difference between us winning a championship or playing a Sunday early morning game (in the consolation round). That's a lot of pressure, but he understands his role and can handle it.

Offensively, the Warriors are led by freshman Jacob Irey, who

has tallied 29 goals and 11 assists in his first varsity season. Tyler Mahncke, Michael Davis, Ioe Giachino, Scott Dobes, Blake Miehe and Bryn Klein are also double-digit scorers. But it's Irey, also selected to the

league's all-star game, who has given the team an unexpected source of firepower.

"He's a gifted player, and he gets the game," said Weinke. "He's strong for his age, and he has a knack for the net. He makes everybody better on his line. Really, he's been a wonderful surprise."

Waterloo will need any offense it can muster to get past Mason City (25-6-2). The Mohawks are one of the league's top defensive

teams, allowing an average of just 1.24 goals per game. Goaltender Austin Maginnis leads the IHSHL in minutes played (1502) shutouts (10) and save percentage (948). His save percentage is the highest in league history for anyone playing more than 650 minutes, and his shutout total is a new record. "He's good," said Weinke.

They've got two all-star defensemen in front of him, and they've been giving him a great opportunity to see the puck. Anybody who beats him has to get traffic around the net."

Waterloo went 0-2-1 against Mason City during the regular season, but could have won all three games. Four power-play goals were the difference in a 6-2 defeat, Mason City scored an empty-net goal in a 2-0 win and the teams tied 1-1.

The Mohawks' offense comes from Brent Schloemer (32 goals. 30 assists) and Mitch Paulsen (25-28). Chris Jessen and Nils Berggren have added 25 points apiece.

"Our guys are excited about it," said Weinke. "We definitely have confidence that we can go in there and play them tough and give ourselves a chance."

The three-day tournament which concludes with Sunday's 1:45 p.m. championship game will also showcase the talents of several other outstanding play-
