Mohawks fall 3-2 in overtime at state tournament opener

DAVENPORT — The Mason City Hockey Club suffered a 3-2 overtime defeat in the opening round of the MHSHL Championship Tournament Friday night to Quad City.

The Mohawks get a chance to get back on track today, though, when they meet Lincoln at 8:30 a.m. in the consolation semifinals.

Quad Cities' Jake Hemmen scored his second goal of the contest in the extra session to give the Blues the victory.

After a scoreless first period, Quad Cities netted the first goal of the game courtesy of Jeff Morris.

Mason City quickly responded with a power-play goal of its own from Ben Wagner off assists from Ben Juhnke and Nic Detra.

The two exchanged goals in the third period, with Hemmen getting his first off an assist from Josh Prygon.

The Mohawks countered with a tying goal from Chris Jessen. Will Martin and Detra were credited with assists.

Lincoln lost its opening

round contest to Waterloo, 2-1. They are the No. 6 seed for the tournament; Mason City is the No. 7 seed.
