Following Echter's momentary surge of momentum was all the Metros could muster up, as they were held scoreless in the final period. Rushmore added a goal with five second left in Saturday's matchup and would eventually take the national 2A crown with a 6-2 win over

With a 4-1 deficit in the 10th minute of the third period, the Metros stared at what seamed to an unthinkable deficit to overcome. But thanks to multiple penalties called against the Screaming

Eagles, Sioux City stormed back.

Kicked off by a score from Tegan Doelman, followed by back-to-back goals from Echter in the final seven minutes, the Metros took advantage of their power play opportunities to push their quarterfinal matchup into overtime.

With eight minutes left in overtime, Doelman sealed Sioux City's spot in the national semifinals. The forward slashed his second goal of Saturday morning's matchup, capping off the Metro's thrilling comeback.

Sioux City finished its season with a Midwest High School Hockey League championship and will lose 11 seniors from its national semifinalist roster.
